### Introduction

OptomCAS is the centralized application service for the schools and colleges of optometry. OptomCAS is a service of the Association of Schools and Colleges of Optometry (ASCO) and is administered by Liaison International, an education information technology company located in Watertown, MA. OptomCAS allows optometry applicants to use a single web-based application and one set of materials to apply to multiple schools and colleges of optometry. Applicants who apply through OptomCAS submit a completed web-based application comprised of biographical data, colleges and universities attended, academic course history, letters of recommendation, work experience, extracurricular activities, honors, and a personal essay. It is the applicant's responsibility to read and follow specific instructions for OptomCAS and the schools and colleges of optometry.

OptomCAS began its first year on July 15, 2009 for Admissions Cycle 2009-2010. All eligible schools and colleges of optometry participated in the centralized application service. This has provided, for the first time, validated numbers for the optometry application process.

This report will focus on OptomCAS Cycle 1, which is the Admissions Cycle 2009-2010. This OptomCAS cycle opened on July 15, 2009 and closed on June 2, 2010. The application fee was \$125 for one institution and \$45 for each additional institution.

## Participating Institutions for 2009-2010

As noted in Table 1, twenty schools and colleges of optometry participated in OptomCAS in Admissions Cycle 2009-2010.

## **OptomCAS Trends**

## **Applicants and Applications**

The number of OptomCAS individual mailed applicants to the twenty schools and colleges of optometry for 2009-2010 was 2,503. These applicants submitted a total of 12,835 applications for an average of 5.13 applications per applicant.

## **Applicants by Offers per Applicant**

Of the 2,503 applicants who applied to OptomCAS with mailed application status, 1,670 (67%) received one or more offers of admission, while 833 (33%) receive no offers (reference Table 3).



## **Demographic Information on the Doctor of Optometry Applicant**

OptomCAS demographic data is captured on the OptomCAS application. This information is optional for the applicant to include and cannot be verified by Liaison staff.

#### Gender



As shown in Figure 1, females consist of 67% (1,672) of the OptomCAS applicant pool with males at 33% (831).

### Age



As shown in Figure 2, the majority of applicants were in the 20-25 age range. The average age for all applicants was 23.9 with a median age of 23. The youngest applicant was 19 and the oldest was 60.

### **Ethnicity**



As shown in Figure 3, the majority of applicants were White (50%) with the other applicants reporting Asian (31%); Black/African-American (5%); Two or More Races (5%); Spanish/Hispanic/Latino/Latina (2%); American Indian/Alaska Native (less than 1%); and Native Hawaiian/Other Pacific Islander (less than 1%). Six percent of applicants did not report a race.

## Citizenship

As shown in Figure 5, the majority of applicants for 2009-2010 were US citizens at 87%. Nine percent of applicants reported they were foreign citizens and 4% US permanent residents.

#### State of Residence

The top five states where OptomCAS applicants claimed their state of residence in 2009-2010 were: California, Texas, New York, Florida, and Illinois. There were 217 applicants from Canada.

### **First Generation College Student**

For 2009-2010, 63% of OptomCAS applicants had a parent who has attended/graduated from college, while 32% of applicants are first generation college students. Four percent of applicants declined to answer the question.

### Military Experience

Only 1% of OptomCAS applicants had previous military experience.

#### **Influences**

The top five influences on why an applicant chose to apply to a Doctor of Optometry program are: non-relative optometrist (48%); a parent who is a non-optometrist (13%); no answer (12%); relative optometrist (8%); and other health professional (5%).

## **Academic Information on the Doctor of Optometry Applicant**

### **Major and Degree**

The most selected major on the OptomCAS application was Biology. The majority of applicants have received or will have received their Bachelor's degree prior to enrollment (if accepted).

#### Institution

The University of California higher education system claims the top five spots for feeder institutions for OptomCAS applicants. These institutions are: University of California, Irvine, University of California, Davis, University of California, San Diego, University of California, Los Angeles, and University of California, Berkeley.


### **GPA**

OptomCAS calculates a standardized GPA to aid the schools and colleges of optometry in evaluating applicants using uniform and consistent criteria. The overall cumulative GPA for all applicants was 3.29 – for males it was 3.27 and 3.30 for females.

# **Accepted Profile of the Doctor of Optometry Applicant\***

### Gender

For Admissions Cycle 2009-2010, 67% of accepted applications were female and 33% were male.

### Age

The median age for accepted applications was 22.6 years old.

### **Ethnicity**

As noted in Table 5, American Indian/Alaska Native applicants had the highest rate of acceptance at 71%; followed by White at 68%; Asian at 67%, Two or More Races at 62%; Spanish/Hispanic/Latino/Latina at 54%; Black/African-American at 44%; and Native Hawaiian/Other Pacific Islander at 0%.

### Citizenship

Eighty-seven percent of applications accepted were US citizens, 10% were foreign applications (this includes Canadian residents), and 3% were permanent residents of the US.

### **GPA**

The GPA range for Cycle 2 for all accepted applications was 3.03 to 3.57.
